

Post Placement and Layout

1) Mark the location of all End, Corner, Transition, and Gate Posts:

□C G□□G C□
□T T□
□T T□

End Posts - where each fence line will terminate.

Corner Posts - where fence line takes a turn

Transition Posts - where fence line takes a step, or a significant change in grade (see below for proper placement).


Gate Posts - where each gate hangs or latches.

2) Mark the location of the line posts between each of these posts.

Option 1: All posts are spaced maximum distance apart except for the last section. Start from the first post and mark the location of each line post (8' on center for Seclusions or 8' 1" on center for Horizons). The last one or two sections will be shorter if layout is not perfect.

Option 2: All posts are spaced evenly apart (not recommended for Horizons). Measure the distance between each of the posts in step one. Determine the number of sections needed by dividing this measurement by 8 and rounding up. Example: 29' / 8 = 3.625 round up to 4 sections. 29' / 4 sect = 7.25' between posts.
